

Intent of AB 130

- LEAs offer all TK- 6 pupils access to *comprehensive* after school and intersessional expanded learning opportunities prioritizing unduplicated pupils.
- Provide all students in low-income communities with no-cost access to **nine hours** of developmentally appropriate academics and enrichment activities by 2025-2026 (i.e. recess, lunch, instructional time and expanded services)
- Develop ELO-P infrastructure with a focus on integrating arts, music and sports programs into enrichment opportunities for students.

Context

- Any TK 6 grade student is eligible to participate.
- **Offer** the ELO Program to all TK/K-6 classroom-based pupils upon parent/guardian request.
- Prioritize service to *unduplicated pupils* (a student classified as an English Learner, eligible for free or reduced meals or is a foster youth) enrolled in the Alum Rock School District
- Program standards need to be aligned with ASES Program
- ASES and ELO-P should be considered a single, comprehensive program
- Provide no less than 9 hours a day of programming when combined with instructional time (ie. intersession and summer)
- Provide programming on all school days and 30 intersession days
- Provide before or after school components on one or multiple sites in the LEA
- Prioritize programs at school sites in lowest income communities while maximizing the number of schools with programs



Highest Needs based on Input


- Majority of families need support through 6 pm

Expanded Learning Parent Survey Winter 2022





What is UPK?


It is the bridge between preschool and Kindergarten for California's children.



Universal Pre-Kindergarten


UPK will bring together programs across early learning and TK-12, relying heavily on Universal Transitional Kindergarten (UTK) and California State Preschool Program (CSPP) as well as Head Start, community-based organizations (CBOs), and private preschool to ensure every four-year old child - regardless of background, race, zip code, immigration status, or income level – has access to a quality learning experience the year before <u>kindergarten</u>

How Do Transitional Kindergarten (TK), UPK and P-3 (Preschool through grade 3) Alignment Work Together?



- P-3 Connects UPK with Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grade
- Aligns developmentally informed best practices, UPK– 3rd grade
- UPK is a mixed-delivery system of UTK, CSPP, Head Start, private providers, and other partnerships
- Provides every four-year old access to high quality learning the year before kindergarten
- TK is an integral program in the mixed delivery system for achieving UPK
- The only program that must serve any four-year old child that wants to enroll by 2025-26.
- Alum Rock has served four-year old children in TK since 2015 prioritizing District funding in this area



Investing in Early Learning Center - FACTs


Investment to strengthen early learning opportunities from prenatal is a change that will holistically support families and children before they reach the formal education classroom
