State Announces Lifting of Regional Stay at Home Order, Returning Santa Clara County to Purple Tier (as it applies to K-12 schools)

- Per CDPH, K-6 schools in counties in Purple Tier with Case Rate (CR) greater than 25 per 100,000 may not reopen for in-person instruction
- 7th-8th grades may not reopen in the Purple Tier
- Care Pods are in operation at all school sites, following the Cohorting Guidance from California Department of Public Health
- Indoor breakrooms are to remain closed
- Youth sports restricted

Blueprint for a Safer Economy

California's Color-Coded County Tier System




Every county in California is assigned to a COVID-19 risk-level tier based on:

- ▶ New cases: The average number of new cases per day, over 7 days, per 100,000 residents
- Positive tests: The percentage of coronavirus tests given per day that are positive for COVID-19
- Health Equity: Although the Health Equity metric does not move a county to a more restrictive tier, meeting specified thresholds for a less restrictive tier can allow a county to progress to a less restrictive tier. Check out the thresholds for progressing to a less restrictive tier via the Health Equity metric.

Tier assignments may occur any day of the week and may occur more than once a week. Select a county to see what region it's in.



All data and tier assignments are based on results from week ending January 23, 2021. See how tiers are assigned and changed, as well as county historical data (California Blueprint Data Chart), at CDPH's Blueprint for a Safer Economy framework. Regional ICU capacity is now calculated using the total number of adult ICU beds in hospitals with an emergency department and does not include neonatal or pediatric ICU beds. Since the Regional Stay Home Order ended on January 25, 2021, the regional ICU capacity no longer includes an adjustment for the percentage of COVID-19 positive patients in ICU.

Counties can restrict further. Check your county's website.

Schools

Schools may not reopen fully for in-person instruction until the county has been in the Substantial (red) tier for 5 days. School officials <u>may decide to conduct in-person instruction</u> for a limited set of students in small cohorts.

Note on exception: Schools that have already re-opened if the county was in a less restrictive tier do not have to close. However, if a school had not already reopened for in-person instruction, it may not reopen until the county moves back to the Substantial (red) tier for 5 consecutive days.



Cases by Zip Code and City

This map summarizes counts and rates of cumulative COVID-19 cases by zip codes in Santa Clara County. ZIP codes with higher rates of cases per 100,000 residents appear as a darker shade of blue than zip codes with lower rates of cases. These data do not necessarily mean that one zip code or neighborhood is more or less safe than another. An increase in the number of tests completed in any one zip code can affect zip code case counts and rates.


PUBLIC COVID-19 Case Rates by Zip Code




Some case counts and rates include cases associated with Long-Term Care Facilities (LTCFs) that are located within these zip codes. Some LTCFs have had clusters of reported COVID-19 cases which impacts the case rates for zip codes where LTCFs are located. Total cases reported for LTCFs include all residents and staff associated cases, regardless of zip code of residence.



Challenges for Alum Rock Union Elementary School District

- Case rates in all ARUSD zip codes remain unsafe and prohibit schools from reopening
- Lack of vaccines provided to the county do not allow staff to be vaccinated at this time
- Additional community challenges
 - Increased unhoused encampments adjacent to sites
 - Large number of multiple family households
 - High concentration of essential workers

Current ARUSD efforts / planning

- Reopening Committee meets weekly for analysis and planning
 - Drafted Reopening Plan
 - Safety
 - Logistics
 - On-going communication & collaboration with community
 - Updates via townhalls, newsletter
 - Family and teacher/staff surveys
- Providing Care Pods at 24 sites

Next steps:

- Re-evaluate reopening as zip codes move to red or orange tiers
- Continue to monitor availability of vaccines for educators
- Survey parents & staff survey window (February 15-28)
- Bring survey data to Board meeting in March

Prevention



- Physical distancing procedures in place (Care Pods, offices, etc.)
- Personal Protective Equipment to each classroom
- Hand-held & backpack sanitation misters distributed (PPE)
- Portable Air Filters distributed to each school
- Cleaning and sanitation schedule and procedures in place district wide

Monitoring and Response



- COVID-19 staff/student daily health screening (in process)
- Administrators trained and monitor COVID-19 procedures
- Regular COVID-19 testing available for employees (through health provider or county)
