Today, I proudly submit to you, my letter of support for the Ethnic Studies Resolution that will establish an Ethnic Studies Adoption Committee for the Alum Rock Union Elementary School District. It has been one of my greatest honors to represent one of the largest Chicano populations in California. East San Jose is one of the most diverse and culturally rich districts in the 10th largest city of the country with a dynamic history that few are aware of. The East Side stands witness to countless untold stories of both challenges as well as proud moments that have changed the trajectory of our history. The East Side is home to our very own Chicano and international iconic social justice hero Cesar Chavez, it is the birthplace of the grape boycott, where then presidential candidate John F. Kennedy stumped for Chicano votes at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, it has been the platform for national notoriety of the lowrider culture, and the site of the largest immigration marches in Northern California. East San Jose is also the birthplace of the widely acclaimed music sensation Los Tigres del Norte.

East San José has historically showcased the cultural and historical dynamics for many decades. East San José has been the epicenter in the City of San José of the Chicano movement.
