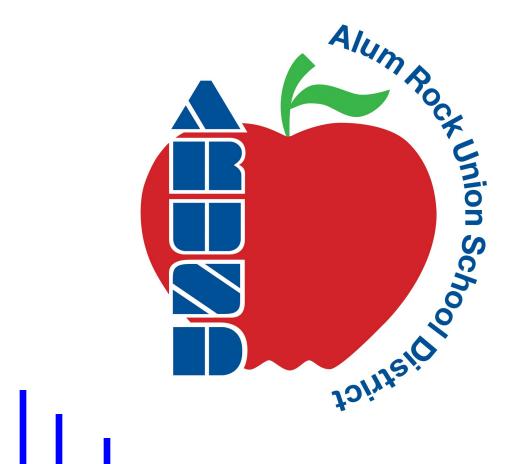

Re: Call for Nominations for CSBA Delegate Assembly - Due Sunday, January 7, 2018

Each year, member boards elect representatives from 21 geographic regions to CSBA's Delegate Assembly. The Delegate Assembly is a vital link in the association's governance and sets the general policy direction for the association. Working with member boards, the Board of Directors, and Executive Committee, Delegates ensure that the association promotes the interests of school districts and county offices of education throughout the state. There are two required Delegate Assembly meetings each year. In 2018, the first meeting will be May 19-20 in Sacramento and the second one will be November 28-29 in San Francisco preceding CSBA's Annual Education Conference and Trade show.

Nomination and candidate biographical sketch forms for CSBA's Delegate Assembly are now being accepted until **Sunday, January 7, 2018**. Nomination instructions are listed below:

- > Any CSBA member board is eligible to nominate board members within their geographical region or subregion and may nominate as many individuals as it chooses by submitting a nomination form for each nominee.
- > All nominees must serve on CSBA member boards and give their approval prior to being nominated.
- All nominees must submit a **onc-page**, **single-sided**, candidate biographical sketch form. An optional one-page, one-sided résumé may also be submitted but cannot be substituted for the biographical sketch form.
- All nomination materials must be postmarked by the U.S.P.S., faxed or emailed no later than 11:59 p.m. on **Sunday, January 7**. It is the nominee's responsibility to confirm that all nomination materials have been received by the CSBA Executive Office by this due date. Late submissions will not be accepted.
- > Ballots will be mailed by Thursday, February 1, 2018 and are due Thursday, March 15, 2018.
- ➤ Elected Delegates serve a two-year term beginning April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2020.

Board Policy

Nondiscrimination In Employment

BP 4030

Personnel

The Governing Board is determined to provide district employees, interns, volunteers, and job applicants a safe, positive environment where they are assured of full and equal employment access and opportunities, protection from harassment or intimidation, and freedom from any fear of reprisal or retribution for asserting their employment rights in accordance with law. This policy shall apply to all district employees and, to the extent required by law, to interns, volunteers, and job applicants.

(cf. 1240 - Volunteer Assistance) (cf. 4111/4211/4311 - Recruitment and Selection)

No district employee shall be discriminated against or harassed by any coworker, supervisor, manager, or other person with whom the employee comes in contact in the course of employment, on the basis of the employee's actual or perceived race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, military and veteran status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, or sexual orientation or his/her association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

(cf. 0410 - Nondiscrimination in District Programs and Activities)

Discrimination in employment based on the characteristics listed above is prohibited in all areas of employment and in all employment-related practices, including the following:

- 1. Discrimination in hiring, compensation, terms, conditions, and other privileges of employment
- 2. Taking of an adverse employment action, such as termination or the denial of employment, promotion, job assignment, or training

(cf. 4151/4251/4351 - Employee Compensation) (cf. 4154/4254/4354 - Health and Welfare Benefits)

3. Unwelcome conduct, whether verbal, physical, or visual, that is so severe or pervasive as to adversely affect an employee's employment opportunities, or that has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with the individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment

- 4. Actions and practices identified as unlawful or discriminatory pursuant to Government Code 12940 or 2 CCR 11006-11086, such as:
- a. Sex discrimination based on an employee's pregnancy, childbirth, breastfeeding, or any related medical condition or on an employee's gender, gender expression, or gender identity, including transgender status

(cf. 4033 - Lactation Accommodation) (cf. 4119.11/4219.11/4319.11 - Sexual Harassment)

- b. Religious creed discrimination based on an employee's religious belief or observance, including his/her religious dress or grooming practices, or based on the district's failure or refusal to use reasonable means to accommodate an employee's religious belief, observance, or practice which conflicts with an employment requirement.
- c. Disability discrimination based on a district requirement for a medical or psychological examination of a job applicant, or an inquiry into whether a job applicant has a mental or physical disability or a medical condition or as to the severity of any such disability or condition, without the showing of a job-related need or business necessity

(cf. 4119.41/4219.41/4319.41 - Employees with Infectious Disease)

d. Disability discrimination based on the district's failure to make reasonable accommodation for the known physical or mental disability of an employee or to engage in a timely, good faith, interactive process with an employee, to determine effective reasonable accommodations for the employee, when he/she has requested reasonable accommodation for a known physical or mental disability or medical condition

The Board also prohibits retaliation against any district employee who opposes any discriminatory employment practice by the district or its employees, agents, or representatives or who complains, testifies, assists, or in any way participates in the district's complaint process pursuant to this policy. No employee who requests an accommodation for any protected characteristic listed in this policy shall be subjected to any punishment or sanction, regardless of whether the request was granted. (Government Code 12940)

Complaints concerning employment discrimination, harassment, or retaliation shall immediately be investigated in accordance with procedures specified in the accompanying administrative regulation.

Any supervisory or management employee who observes or has knowledge of an incident of prohibited discrimination or harassment shall report the incident to the Superintendent or designated district coordinator as soon as practical after the incident. All other employees are encouraged to report such incidents to their supervisor immediately. The district shall protect any employee who reports such incidents from retaliation.

The Superintendent or designee shall use all appropriate means to reinforce the district's nondiscrimination policy. He/she shall provide training and information to employees about how to recognize harassment, discrimination, or other related conduct, how to respond appropriately, and components of the district's policies and regulations regarding discrimination. The Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the district's employment practices and, as necessary, shall take action to ensure district compliance with the nondiscrimination laws.

In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall post, in a conspicuous place on district premises, the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing publication on workplace discrimination and harassment issued pursuant to 2 CCR 11013.

Any district employee who engages in prohibited discrimination, harassment, or retaliation or who aids, abets, incites, compels, or coerces another to engage or attempt to engage in such behavior in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

Nondiscrimination In Employment and Complaints Concerning Discrimination In Employment

AR 4031

Personnel

All allegations of discrimination in employment, including those involving an intern, volunteer, or job applicant, shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with procedures specified in this administrative regulation.

The district designates the position identified below as its coordinator for nondiscrimination in employment (coordinator) to coordinate the district's efforts to comply with state and federal nondiscrimination laws and to answer inquiries regarding the district's nondiscrimination policies. Measures to Prevent Discrimination

To prevent unlawful discrimination, harassment, and retaliation in district employment, the Superintendent or designee shall implement the following measures:

- 1. Publicize the district's nondiscrimination policy and regulation, including the complaint procedures and the coordinator's contact information, by: (5 CCR 4960; 34 CFR 100.6, 106.9)
- a. Including them in each announcement, bulletin, or application form that is used in employee recruitment
- b. Posting them in all district schools and offices, including staff lounges and other prominent locations
- c. Posting them on the district's web site and providing easy access to them through district-supported social media, when available
- (cf. 1113 District and School Web Sites)
- (cf. 1114 District-Sponsored Social Media)
- 2. Disseminate the district's nondiscrimination policy to all employees by one or more of the

following methods: (2 CCR 11023)

- a. Printing and providing a copy of the policy to all employees, with an acknowledgment form for each employee to sign and return
- b. Sending the policy via email with an acknowledgment return form
- c. Posting the policy on the district intranet with a tracking system ensuring all employees have read and acknowledged receipt of the policies
- d. Discussing the policy with employees upon hire and/or during a new hire orientation session
- e. Any other way that ensures employees receive and understand the policy

- 3. Provide to employees a handbook that contains information that clearly describes the district's nondiscrimination policy, procedures for filing a complaint, and resources available to anyone who feels that he/she has been the victim of any discriminatory or harassing behavior
- 4. Provide training to employees, volunteers, and interns regarding the district's nondiscrimination policy, including what constitutes unlawful discrimination, harassment, and retaliation and how and to whom a report of an incident should be made

Training for supervisors shall include the requirement to report any complaint of misconduct to a designated representative, such as the coordinator, human resources manager, or Superintendent or designee as a topic in the sexual harassment prevention training required pursuant to 2 CCR 11024 (2 CCR 11023)

- 5. Periodically review the district's recruitment, hiring, and promotion processes and regularly monitor the terms, conditions, and privileges of employment to ensure district compliance with law
- 6. For any district facility where 10 percent of employees have a language other than English as their spoken language, translate the policy into every language spoken by at least 10 percent of the workforce

Complaint Procedure

Any complaint alleging unlawful discrimination or harassment shall be addressed in accordance with the following procedures:

1. Notice and Receipt of Complaint: A complainant may inform his/her direct supervisor, another supervisor, the coordinator, the Superintendent or, if available, a complaint hotline or an ombudsman.

The complainant may file a written complaint in accordance with this procedure, or if he/she is an employee, may first attempt to resolve the situation informally with his/her supervisor.

A supervisor or manager who has received information about an incident of discrimination or harassment, or has observed such an incident, shall report it to the coordinator, whether or not the complainant files a written complaint.

The written complaint should contain the complainant's name, the name of the individual who allegedly committed the act, a description of the incident, the date and location where the incident occurred, any witnesses who may have relevant information, other evidence of the discrimination or harassment, and any other pertinent information which may assist in investigating and resolving the complaint.

2. Investigation Process: The coordinator shall initiate an impartial investigation of an allegation of discrimination or harassment within five business days of receiving notice of the alleged discriminatory or harassing behavior, regardless of whether a written complaint has been filed or whether the written complaint is complete.

The coordinator shall meet with the complainant to describe the district's complaint procedure and discuss the actions being sought by the complainant in response to the allegation. The coordinator shall inform the complainant that the investigation of the allegations will be fair, timely, and thorough and will be conducted in a manner that provides all parties due process and reaches reasonable conclusions based on the evidence collected. He/she shall also inform the parties that the investigation will be kept confidential to the extent possible, but that some information may be revealed as necessary to conduct an effective investigation.

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If the coordinator determines that a detailed fact-finding investigation is necessary, he/she shall begin the investigation immediately. As part of this investigation, the coordinator should interview the complainant, the person accused, and other persons who could be expected to have relevant information.

The coordinator shall track and document the progress of the investigation to ensure reasonable progress and shall inform the parties as necessary.

When necessary to carry out his/her investigation or to protect employee safety, the coordinator may discuss the complaint with the Superintendent or designee, district legal counsel, or the district's risk manager.

The coordinator also shall determine whether interim measures, such as scheduling changes, transfers, or leaves, need to be taken before the investigation is completed to ensure that further incidents are prevented. The coordinator shall ensure that such interim measures do not constitute retaliation.

3. Written Report on Findings and Remedial/Corrective Action: No more than 20 business days after receiving the complaint, the coordinator shall conclude the investigation and prepare a written report of his/her findings. This timeline may be extended for good cause. If an extension is needed, the coordinator shall notify the parties and explain the reasons for the extension.

The report shall include the decision and the reasons for the decision and shall summarize the steps taken during the investigation. If a determination has been made that discrimination or harassment occurred, the report also shall include any corrective action(s) that have been or will be taken to address the behavior, provide appropriate options for remedial actions and resolutions for the complainant, and ensure that retaliation or further discrimination or harassment is prevented.

The report shall be presented to the complainant, the person accused, and the Superintendent or designee.

4. Appeal to the Governing Board: The complainant or the person accused may appeal any findings to the Board within 10 business days of receiving the written report of the coordinator's findings. The Superintendent or designee shall provide the Board with all information presented during the investigation. Upon receiving an appeal, the Board shall schedule a hearing as soon as practicable. Any complaint against a district employee shall be addressed in closed session in accordance with law. The Board shall render its decision within 10 business days.

Other Remedies

In addition to filing a discrimination or harassment complaint with the district, a person may file a complaint with either the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC). The time limits for filing such complaints are as follows:

1. To file a valid complaint with DFEH, within one year of the alleged discriminatory act(s), unless an exception exists pursuant to Government Code 12960

- 2. To file a valid complaint directly with EEOC, within 180 days of the alleged discriminatory act(s) (42 USC 2000e-5)
- 3. To file a valid complaint with EEOC after first filing a complaint with DFEH, within 300 days of the alleged discriminatory act(s) or within 30 days after the termination of proceedings by DFEH, whichever is earlier (42 USC 2000e-5)

Board Policy

Superintendent's Contract

BP 2121

Administration

The Governing Board believes that the Superintendent's employment contract should outline the framework through which the Board and Superintendent are to work together to achieve district goals and objectives. When approving the Superintendent's employment contract, the Board shall consider the need for stability in district administration and shall ensure the best use of district resources.

The contract shall be reviewed by the district's legal counsel and may include the following:

1. General duties and responsibilities of the position

(cf. 2110 - Superintendent Responsibilities and Duties)

- 2. Term of the contract, which shall be for no more than four years pursuant to Education Code 35031
- 3. Length of the work year and hours of work
- 4. Salary, health and welfare benefits, and other compensation for the position

(cf. 4154/4254/4354 - Health and Welfare Benefits)

5. Reimbursement of work-related expenses, including mileage reimbursement, consistent with Board policies, regulations, and guidelines applicable to other professional administrative staff

(cf. 3350 – Travel Expenses)

The contract may also address payment for professional dues and activities, the district's provision of cell phones or other technological devices, and the Superintendent's use of his/her personal vehicle.

6. Vacation, illness and injury leave, and personal leaves

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7. Criteria, process, and procedure for annual evaluation of the Superintendent

- 8. Conditions and process for termination of the contract including the maximum cash settlement that the Superintendent may receive If the contract is terminated prior to its expiration date
- 9. A statement that any subsequent increase in the Superintendent's salary shall be at the sole discretion of the Board
- 10. A statement that there shall be no automatic renewal or extension of the contract, although the Board can enter into a new contract with the Superintendent prior to the expiration of the existing contract
- 11. Timeline for providing written notice to the Superintendent if the Board does not wish to enter into a new contract, which shall be at least 45 days in advance of the expiration of the term of the contract pursuant to Education Cod 35031, and the responsibility of the Superintendent to remind the Board in a timely manner of the requirement to give notice
- 12. Matters related to liability and indemnification against demands, claims, suits, actions, and legal proceedings brought against the Superintendent in his/her official capacity in the performance of duties related to his/her employment

The Board may deliberate about terms of the contract in closed session at a regular meeting. Discussions regarding the salary, salary schedule, or other compensation may occur in closed session only as permitted under Government Code 54957.6 between the Board and its designated representative(s) (the "labor exception"), for the purpose of reviewing the Board's position or instructing the designated representative(s) prior to or during bona fide negotiations with the current or prospective Superintendent. (Government Code 54956, 54957, 54957.6)

The Board may consult with district legal counsel prior to holding a closed session with the designated representative(s) to discuss compensation to be paid to the current or prospective Superintendent.

Terms of the contract shall remain confidential until the ratification process commences.

The Board shall take final action on the Superintendent's contract in an open meeting, which shall be reflected in the Board's minutes. Copies of the contract shall be available to the public upon request. (Government Code 53262, 54957.6)

Termination of Contract

Prior to the expiration of the contract, the Board may terminate the Superintendent's employment contract in accordance with law and applicable contract provisions.

In such an event, any cash settlement that the Superintendent may receive upon termination of the contract shall not exceed his/her monthly salary multiplied by the number of months left on the contract or, if the unexpired term of the contract is more than 18 months and the contract was executed prior to January 1, 2016, no greater than the Superintendent's monthly salary multiplied by 18. For any contract executed on or after January 1, 2016, any cash settlement shall not exceed the Superintendent's monthly salary multiplied by 12. (Government Code 53260)

The cash settlement shall not include any noncash items other than health benefits, which may be continued for the same duration of time as covered in the settlement or until the Superintendent finds other employment, whichever occurs first. (Government Code 53260, 53261)

However, when the termination of the Superintendent's contract is based upon the Board's belief and subsequent confirmation through an independent audit that the Superintendent has engaged in fraud, misappropriation of funds, or other illegal fiscal practices, no cash or noncash settlement of any amount shall be provided. (Government Code 53260)

In addition, if the Superintendent is convicted of a crime involving an abuse of his/her office or position, he/she shall reimburse the district for payments he/she receives as paid leave salary pending investigation or as cash settlement upon his/her termination, and for any funds expended by the district in his/her defense against a crime involving his/her office or position. (Government Code 53243-53243.4, 53260)

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has a fiduciary duty to meet its financial obligations in the current fiscal year and two subsequent fiscal years pursuant to Education Code 42127; and

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2017, the Santa Clara County Office of Education issued an conditional approval of the Alum Rock Union Elementary School District's budget for 2017-18, and requested that the district respond to the conditions set forth in the conditional approval by October 8, 2017; and

WHEREAS, examples of the conditions set forth in the conditional approval included additional information on the action plans related to the FCMAT audit, provide information on the budget assumptions which appear understated, make efforts to prepare timely monthly cash reconciliation along with an intent to provide a cash flow statement in the near future, as well as, make initial efforts towards identifying funds to service the non-voter approved debt; and

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2017, the district responded to the conditional approval of the budget for 2017-18 and multi-year financial projections; and

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2017, the Santa Clara County Office of Education acknowledged the district's efforts, and in accordance with Education Code sections 42127(f) and (g) completed their review of the district's budget for 2017-18 and approved such budget; and

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2017, the Santa Clara County Office of Education determined that the district is in need of the support of a Fiscal Expert appointed by the County Superintendent of Schools to assist the district in addressing remaining long-term issues that demonstrate that the district has financial distress as defined by Education Code section 42127.6; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Expert shall commence on January 1, 2018 and the role of such expert shall be to monitor implementation and provide leadership in the following areas:

Report quarterly the current status of planned action(s) for each recommendation of the FCMAT audit dated June 9, 2017;

Clarify the budget assumptions that appear to be understated, or provide revisions;

Prepare the monthly cash reconciliation by each monthly due date and inform us of the actions being taken to clear long-outstanding reconciling items;

Prepare a cash flow report for the current fiscal year that utilizes the ending cash balance from the June 30, 2017 monthly reconciliation as verified by a third party auditor retained by the district and approved by the Santa Clara County Office of Education;

Prepare the debt service plan for non-voter approved debt that present the source of funds for the full repayment period along with any board resolutions necessary to move cash between funds; and

WHEREAS, these actions must be taken to maintain the fiscal stability of the district, restore the creditability of the district's financial leadership and operations, and insure that the district is able to sustain a quality education program for our students.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education of the Alum Rock Union Elementary School District finds, determines, declares, orders and resolves as follows:

- 1. That all of the recitals set forth above are true and correct, and the Board so finds and determines.

2017 - 2018 First Interim Report

Staff Analysis:

The First Interim Report is one measure designed to help the County and ultimately the State to monitor each school district's fiscal health. According to the State requirements, in order to have a Positive Certification, ARUESD must project at least 3% in unrestricted reserves in each of the current and following two years. Districts that may not meet this requirement receive a qualified budget certification and Districts that do not demonstrate that they will meet this requirement receive a negative budget certification. If any problems are anticipated, the County will offer immediate fiscal management advisory services.

School districts in California are required to maintain their financial affairs in accordance with prudent financial management principles. Those principles were strengthened and codified in 1991 with the passage of AB 1200. The increased oversight provided by AB 1200 was in response to a number of school district near-bankruptcies, requests for state loans, and defaults on school district financial obligations.

The statute requires school districts to self-certify budgets, interim reports, unaudited actuals, and disclosure statements related to collective bargaining. The law also requires county offices of education (COE) to review the various certifications and determine whether the financial position of the district is in conformance with state-recommended standards and criteria. The COE is empowered to initiate action if problems are disclosed or discovered. That action may take the form of additional questions or warnings, a lowering of the self-rating from "positive" to either "qualified" or "negative," appointment of a fiscal advisor, or more stringent measures if the situation warrants.

The Alum Rock Union Elementary School District is presenting a Positive Certification of its financial condition. This means that the District will be able to meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year, subsequent fiscal year two and year three.

Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of the First Interim Financial Report for 2017 – 2018.

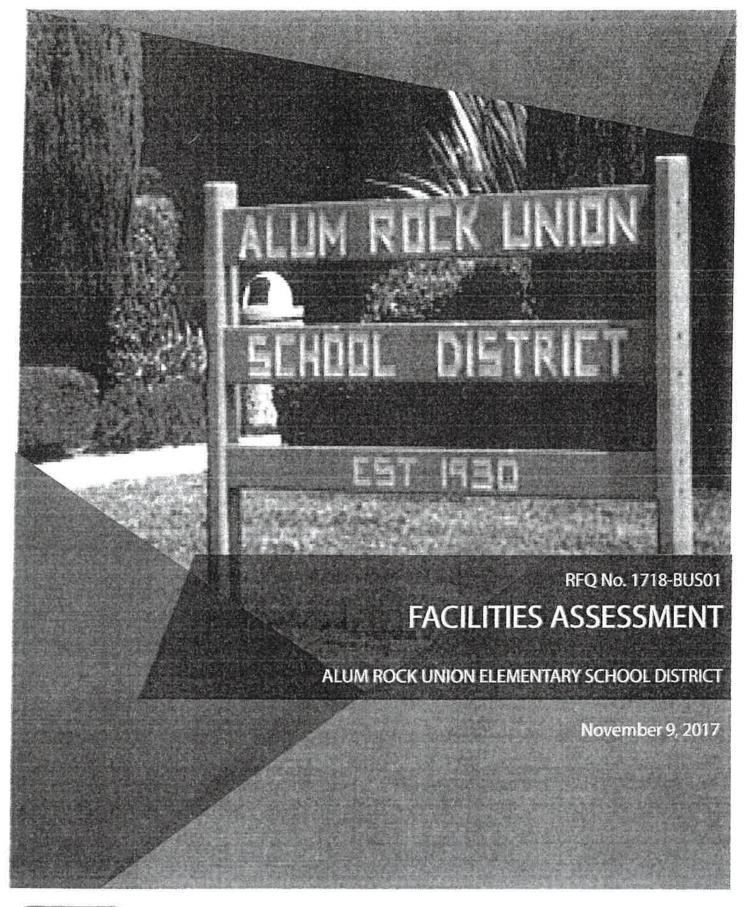

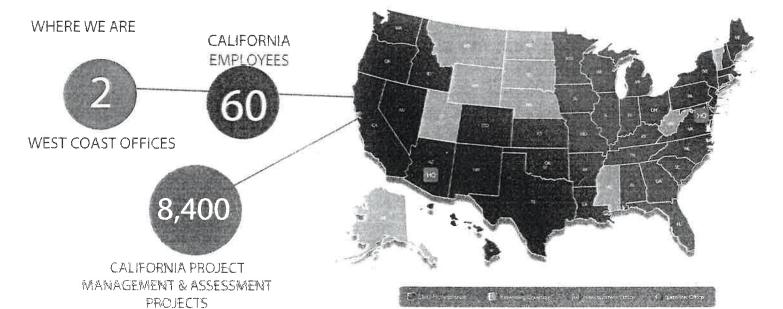

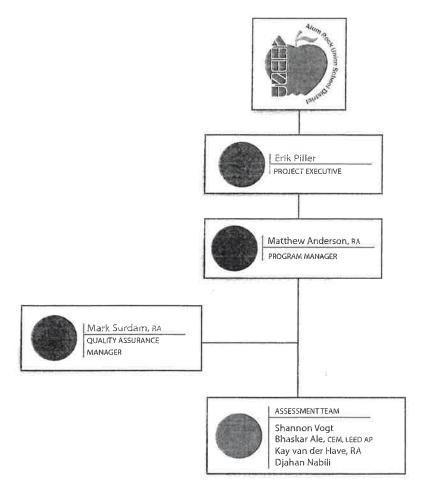

3 - PROJECT APPROACH

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

EMG understands that, should we be awarded the Facilities Assessment project, we would be responsible for providing consulting services to prepare the District's Facility Assessments for 25 buildings. The goal of the assessment is to enable the District to address facility maintenance needs over the next 20 years.

TECHNICAL APPROACH

Prior to assessments beginning, EMG will conduct a Kick-off Meeting to review requirements and consolidate exhibits such as drawings and prior completed reports.

During the term of the project, EMG will conduct regular Progress Meetings to maintain open communication with the entire project team and the District. EMG will lead with an agenda that includes a focus on work plan, schedule, and project needs. This will permit the opportunity to proactively address challenges encountered, so course adjustments may be made. Each meeting will conclude with task assignments, schedules, and goals to be met. The Team will conduct a walk-through survey of the facility and site to observe systems and components, identify physical deficiencies, and formulate recommendations to remedy the physical deficiencies. We will survey 100% of each facility (exterior and grounds (building exterior, roofs, sidewalk/pavement, recreational areas)).

The Team will interview building maintenance staff about the property's historical repairs and replacements and their costs, level of preventive maintenance exercised, pending repairs and improvements, and frequency of repairs and replacements.

The Team will develop opinions based on the site assessment, interviews with District building maintenance staff, and interviews with relevant maintenance contractors, municipal authorities, and experience gained on similar properties previously evaluated. The Team may question others knowledgeable of the subject property's physical condition and operation or knowledgeable of similar systems to gain comparative information to use in evaluation of the property.

The Team will review documents and information provided by the District's maintenance staff that could also aid the knowledge of the subject property's physical improvements, extent and type of use, and/or assist in identifying material discrepancies between reported information and observed conditions. A meeting will be held with District staff to review the draft report before assessing the remaining buildings.

SITE ASSESSMENTS

The Facility Condition Assessment will focus on the following facility system components:

Site + Infrastructure

- Topography: Observe general topography and note any unusual or problematic features or conditions observed or reported.
- Ingress and Egress: Identify and note locations of major means of access and egress at the facility, and any unusual or restraining conditions observed or reported.
- Paving, Curbing, and Parking: Identify material types of paving and curbing systems at the property.
- Flatwork: Identify material flatwork at the subject property (sidewalks, plazas, patios).
- · Landscaping and Appurtenances: Identify material landscaping features and material types (fences, retaining

- walls), and site appurtenances (irrigation systems, fountains, lighting, signage, ponds).
- Utilities: Identify the type and provider of material utilities provided to the property (water, electricity, natural gas, etc.). EMG will assess condition, physical deficiencies, life cycle repair, and replacement issues.

Structural Frame + Building Envelope

- Identify material elements of the structural frame and exterior walls (foundation, floor framing, roof framing, facade or curtain-wall, and glazing systems; exterior sealant, doors, and stairways).
- Observe general conditions and note any physical deficiencies identified or unusual items or conditions observed.

- Observe representative operable and fixed panels on all facades, operating a representative sample of units to assess hardware, and to visually inspect exterior conditions and the condition of waterproofing seals.
- Assess curtain wall condition to determine water infiltration, damage, caulk degradation, metal panel degradation, stone degradation and anchoring, and other related curtain wall issues.

Roofing (Non-Invasive Visual)

- Identify material roof systems (roof type, reported age, slope, drainage). Also identify any unusual roofing conditions or rooftop equipment.
- Observe general conditions of the roof system (membranes, attachment methods, flashings, counter flashings, pitch pans, gravel stops, parapets, miscellaneous appurtenances, insulation).

- Identify material heat generating systems at the property.
- Observe general conditions, identify reported equipment age, note past material component replacements/ upgrades, note the apparent level of maintenance, and identify if a maintenance contract is in place. If heating equipment is not operational at the time of the walk-through survey, provide an opinion of the condition to the

- extent reasonably possible.
- Identify and observe any special or unusual heating systems or equipment present (fireplaces, solar heat) and note reported material problems or inadequacies.

Air-Conditioning + Ventilation

- Identify material air-conditioning and ventilation systems at the property. Include material equipment (cooling towers, chillers (type of refrigerant used), package units, split systems, air handlers, thermal storage equipment).
- Identify material distribution systems (supply and return, make-up air, exhaust) at the property.
- Observe general conditions, identify reported equipment age, note past material component upgrades/ replacements, and apparent level of maintenance, and identify if a maintenance contract is in place (name of the contractor). If air-conditioning and ventilation systems are not operational at the time of the walk-through survey, provide an opinion of the condition to the extent reasonably possible.
- Observe general conditions and note any physical deficiencies identified or unusual items or conditions observed. Include any material reported system inadequacies or operating deficiencies.
- Identify and observe any special or unusual air-conditioning and ventilation systems or equipment (cold storage systems, special computer cooling equipment) and note material reported problems or system inadequacies.

Electrical

- Identify the electrical service provided and distribution system at the property. Include material switchgear disconnects, circuit breakers, transformers, meters, emergency generators, general lighting systems, and other equipment or systems.
- Observe general electrical items (distribution panels, type of wiring, energy management systems, emergency power, lightning protection).
- Observe general conditions and note any physical deficiencies identified or unusual items or conditions observed. Also note the presence of any special or unusual electrical equipment, systems, or devices at the property, and include reported material problems or system inadequacies.

Elevators + Vertical Transportation

- Identify vertical transportation systems at the property (equipment manufacturer, equipment type, location, number, capacity).
- Observe elevator cabs, finishes, call and communication equipment, etc.
- Identify the company providing elevator/escalator maintenance at the property. Observe general conditions and note any physical deficiencies identified or unusual items or conditions observed or reported including any reported material system inadequacies.

Life Safety + Fire Protection

- Identify material life safety/fire protection systems at the property (sprinklers and stand pipes (wet or dry), fire hydrants, fire alarm systems, water storage, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, emergency lighting, stairwell pressurization, smoke evacuation).
- Observe general conditions and note any material physical deficiencies identified or unusual items or conditions observed or reported including any reported system inadequacies.

Interior Elements

- Identify offices, special use areas and building standard finishes (flooring, ceilings, walls). Furnishings and fixed components will be reviewed and included in the cost estimate tables for replacements. EMG will identify material building amenities or special features.
- Observe general conditions and note any physical deficiencies identified or unusual items or conditions observed or reported.

Food Service Spaces and Equipment

 Assess all food service equipment and spaces (kitchen, cafeteria, dining, serving areas) and evaluate it for adherence to life/safety code and ventilation requirements as well for condition and capital replacement.

Special Systems and Equipment

Include all special systems and equipment (Emergency Medical Systems, chillers, radio towers, equipment lifts, chair lifts, chair lifts, chemical storage or treatment areas, storage tanks, dumbwaiters, yaults, public address systems, telephone systems).

Accessibility Compliance

- Provide a general statement of the building's ADA compliance to help identify whether the District may be exposed to issues and whether there is the need for further review.
- Use an ADA Compliance checklist compliant with ASTM E2018-15. This review does not constitute a measured study and a more detailed ADA evaluation or transition plan is available as an additional service.
- Evaluate interior and exterior elements that could present external or internal barriers to accessibility by disabled persons.
- Perform a site review to determine major barriers into the buildings, through the buildings, to restroom facilities, and to other service areas within the building.

Moisture Affected Materials (Mold)

EMG will perform a limited assessment of accessible areas for the presence of mold, conditions conducive to mold growth, and/or evidence of moisture. We will also interview project personnel regarding the presence of any known or suspected mold, elevated relative humidity, water intrusion, or mildew-like odors. Potentially affected areas will be photographed and recommendations for any additional moisture intrusion studies will be made.

Environmental Features

EMG will review environmental features of the property (appearance, cleanliness, acoustics, ventilation, humidity).

Energy Conservation Analysis

As part of the analysis of all evaluated systems mentioned above, EMG will consider energy conservation savings when making repair or replace recommendations and include these projects in the project prioritization. EMG can provide an Energy Audit as additional services (ASHRAE Level I, II, or III) or Benchmarking (EnergyStar) services.

EDUCATIONAL ADEQUACY ASSESSMENT

EMG has experience developing educational specifications and evaluation criteria for assessing educational adequacy across a portfolio of diverse schools. Our team will work with the District to translate the Ed Spec and instructional model into an objective set of evaluation criteria in order to assess and measure need in each school. Deficiencies and shortfalls will be identified and cost to modernize will be calculated for each upgrade required. EMG will make recommendations to modify educational specifications to be consistent with the District's educational program or per input from District Staff.

SPACE UTILIZATION EVALUATION

EMG will review the enrollment projection reports to determine current and future needs. EMG will preparing a space and program analysis that includes evaluating capacities and detailing building shortfalls with respect to spaces required. These components will be combined into conclusions and recommendations that meet the requirements of the District.

RANKING AND CLASSIFICATION

Based upon observations, research and judgment, along with consulting commonly accepted empirical Expected Useful Life (EUL) tables, EMG will render our opinion as to when a system or component will most probably necessitate replacement.

Accurate historical replacement records provided by the facility manager are typically the best source for this data. Exposure to the weather elements, initial system quality and installation, extent of use, quality, and amount of preventive maintenance exercised are all factors that impact the effective age of a system or component. As a result, a system or component may have an effective age that is greater or less than its actual age. The Remaining Useful Life (RUL) of a component or system equals the EUL less its effective age.

The analysis will include all cost observations be ranked by Priority Classes. The five classes to the right are typical but can be altered to meet the District's needs. The deficiencies observed will be classified into categories such as those below using the Uniformat System (up to 6 or 8 levels).

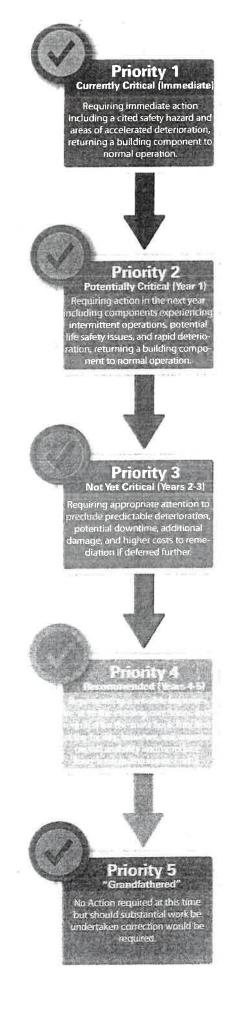

COST ESTIMATING

Each report will include a Capital Needs Analysis including an estimated cost for each system or component repair or replacement anticipated during the evaluation term. The report narrative will discuss options for repair of the deficiency, and the capital needs analysis will be presented as an Excel-based cost table that includes a summary of the description of each component, age and estimated RUL, anticipated year of repair or replacement, quantity, unit cost, and total cost for the repair of each line item.

A consolidated Capital Needs Analysis will be presented that includes all anticipated capital needs for all buildings. In addition to the detailed description of the deficiencies, we will provide cost estimates for the deficiencies noted. The cost estimate for capital deficiencies will be based on the estimate for maintenance and repair, but may, at the District's option, also include project management, construction, and design fees derived using actual costs from previous projects. After determining these costs, we will confirm them with District staff.

EMG's cost estimating database is comprised of both Whitestone Research and RS Means data, and further customized with proprietary cost tables developed by EMG, based on historical and localized actual costs. EMG maintains and updates our cost estimating system with information received from the field. Through construction monitoring work, we have current cost data from hundreds of in-progress construction and rehabilitation projects. This data allows us to calculate costs based on local conditions to maintain a cost database that is typically more current than Whitestone Research and RS Means' models.



REPORT DELIVERABLES

EMG will provide a report including a description of each of the building components and systems. Each report is organized by building system and will include digital photos of major systems and components and of all deficiencies identified. Reports will include discussion of current and anticipated repairs and deficiencies, and applicable options for repair or maintenance of building components.

Our data collection platform allows for Capital Planning reports if the District requires them. The Capital Needs analysis will include a cost database sorted by building system and ranked by priority for repair. The format of the database will allow for the customization of reporting by building, system, or priority for repair, and a year-by-year analysis of capital needs.

A report will be generated for each building that includes discussion of recommended repairs and component life cycle replacements. If the District requires a Facility Condition Index (FCI), the FCI will be calculated for each building as a function of required repairs compared to building replacement costs. The FCI will be generated from the data collection/capital planning database and will be updated as components age or are replaced.

Reports can reflect a 1, 5, 10, or 20-year capital plan based on EMG's 20-year building system evaluation. The analysis can include a cost table sorted by building and system and ranked by priority for repair. Tables will allow for the customization of reporting and a year-by-year capital needs analysis. The report will include:

- A 10 or 20-Year Capital Plan with an Executive Summary with graphic presentation of results to provide a quick, user-friendly summary of the property's observed condition and estimated costs assigned by category. These estimated costs shall be cross-referenced to report sections where an elaboration of cost issues will be presented.
- Components observed exhibiting deferred maintenance issues and provide estimates for immediate and capital repair costs based on observed conditions, available maintenance history and industry-standard useful life estimates. If applicable, this analysis will include the review of any available documents pertaining to capital improvements completed within the last five-year periods, or currently under contract. EMG shall also inquire about available maintenance records and procedures and interview current available on-site maintenance staff.
- Recommended schedule for replacement or repairs (schedule of priorities).
- Digital photographs for the buildings including photos of deficiencies.
- General description of the property and improvements and comment generally on observed conditions.
- Critical repairs and life safety issues separately from repairs anticipated over the term of the analysis.
- If requested, an FCI number for the building.

In addition to each building report, if requested, EMG can develop a Program-wide Report that includes a ranked system-wide Capital Plan for all facilities with programmatic conclusions and recommendations. The Program Report includes a brief narrative description of each facility/building component and system, and discusses the current, anticipated repairs, deficiencies, and of all buildings assessed. The Program Report analyses will include tables sorted by building system and ranked by priority for repair. The



format of the tables will allow for the several perspectives of reporting by FCI, building, system, or priority for repair, and a year-by-year analysis of capital needs.

Reports are submitted as drafts, and once finalized, a program summary report is provided to include a roll-up of all prioritized capital needs across all facilities.

ASSESSMENT SOFTWARE: ASSETCALC™

EMG will utilize AssetCALC™ as its platform for all data collected on this project. AssetCALC™ is a web-based SQL system that allows users to query information regarding specific items or across the entire asset portfolio. This streamlines the capital planning process by compiling funding requirements for deficiencies to create budget models based on project priority and life cycle maintenance and repair requirements. **The use of this software is at your option and there are no licensing fees for this software for two (2) years.**

AssetCALC™ data can be exported to an Excel, XML, or an ODBC database format compatible for upload into most CMMS or work-order systems.

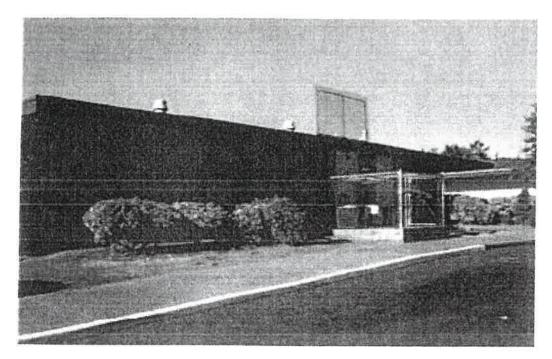

Evergreen School District FACILITY ASSESSMENT AND ENERGY AUDIT





EMG performed a Facility Condition Assessment and Prop 39 compliant Energy Audit performed for Evergreen School District. This program was to serve as a prototype analysis. The first school chosen to be evaluated was Cadwallader Elementary School located in San Jose, California. This project was done in conjunction with the district and their architect AEDIS Architects.

The Facility Condition Assessment scope included collecting facility condition, program and space data and populating that data into a third-party platform through a remote interface that synced data directly into the database. EMG determined deficiencies and made recommendations for remedial or replacement options accompanied with cost estimates. Deficiencies were prioritized in order of important for action.

The Energy Audit was an ASHRAE Level II audit which consisted of energy audits of the schools, identifying opportunities to reduce the energy consumption and increase cost savings. Major recommendations included building-wide lighting upgrades and implementation of advanced lighting controls, replacement of old HVAC equipment and motors with premium efficiency alternatives, installation of demand limiting controls and sub-metering, installation of VFD on several pumps and fans, implementation of DDC controls with Energy Management System, and initiation of an energy awareness program that changes behavioral patterns of individuals to conserve energy. EMG determined the Energy Conservation Measures that were appropriate for the District to consider, and prioritized them with respective cost estimates and paybacks.

The deliverable included both electronic and hardcopy reports that were a combination of narrative, photos, and data tables. EMG also delivered a real-time capital planning tool and asset management database that is cloud accessible.

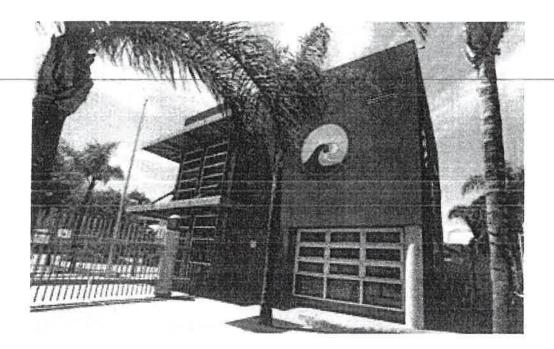

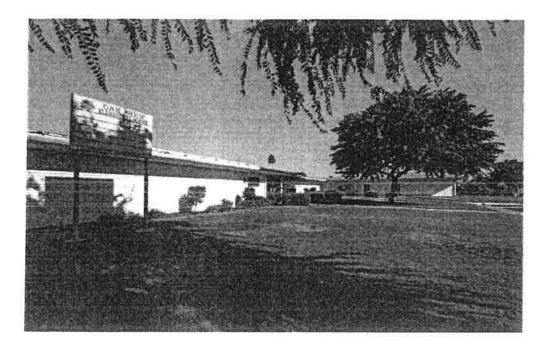

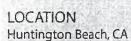




Ocean View School District of Orange County hired DLR Group to develop a Long Range Facilities Master Plan.

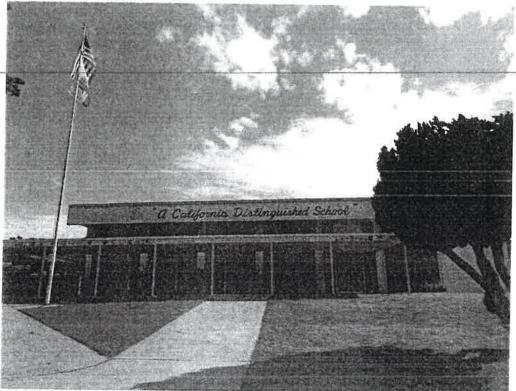

EMG was selected to perform a Facility Condition Assessment for the Palos Verdes Unified School District in California. The project consisted of 24 facilities totaling 993,328 SF. The purpose of this assessment was to develop a list of immediate priorities, identify a long range capital plan and to show which facilities had the most critical need to assist in budget capital needs for the next 5 to 10 years. EMG identified actions needed to adapt the facilities to future needs of the county, along with codes, standards, and changing technology.

Ms. Marie Sanchez, Recording Secretary, announced to the audience that all votes would be taken by Roll Call.

2. BOARD BUSINESS

2.01 Approval of Amended Job Description for Deputy Superintendent

MOTION #05-01 by Clerk Dolores Marquez-Frausto to approve the Amended Job Description for Deputy Superintendent. MOTION #05-01 was seconded by President Khanh Tran.

Public Comments:

- 1) Camille Fontanilla Spoke in favor of Superintendent Hilaria Bauer. She read a letter on behalf of approximately 40 community members in support of Superintendent Hilaria Bauer remaining as Superintendent. He spoke against the Deputy Superintendent reporting directly to the Board and not to the Superintendent this would definitely create a mess!

- 7) Frank Chavez Previous Board Member and a community member that commented that he was representing the Citizen's Oversight Committee and was in support of Dr. Hilaria Bauer remaining as our Superintendent. He commented that if you have a good Superintendent, you do not need a Deputy Superintendent!
- 8) Gustavo Gonzalez Previous Board Member and community member that commented that he was also representing the Citizen's Oversight Committee and was in support of Dr. Hilaria Bauer remaining as our Superintendent. He commented that all five Board Members need to focus on the students and that the agendas do not show this!
- 9) Alison Cingolani Citizen's Oversight Committee member that read two statements taken from the ARUSD website, Board of Trustees, Philosophy of ARUSD: "Accountability for the District's programs and operations is shared by the entire educational community, with the ultimate accountability resting with the Board as the basic embodiment of representative government" and "A high level of communication, trust, respect, and teamwork among Board Members and the Superintendent contributes to effective decision-making"

 Lastly, she stated that we should do the right thing and focus on education!
- 10) Female Speaker Citizen's Oversight Committee member that was present and was in support of Dr. Hilaria Bauer remaining as our Superintendent.
- 11) Ray Mueller Chair of the Citizen's Oversight Committee spoke in favor of Dr. Hilaria Bauer remaining as our Superintendent. He stated that changing administration at this time would again disrupt the good things happening in the District—we need continuity because then staff is also impacted!
- 12) Vince Iwasaki Mathson Principal and ARAA President representing the administrators. He requested that the Board stop interfering with the Superintendent's job—we just started school. He encouraged the Board to extend the Superintendent's contract.

- 5) Diltza Gonzales Community member stated that she supports this community. She is in support of Superintendent Hilaria Bauer remaining our District Superintendent. The Board needs to be held accountable for the District and it's success or failure.
- 6) Maria Elena Ruiz Ocala teacher that has been through four (4) Superintendents and she commented to the Board, 'Why are we here tonight giving up our family time when there is no reason to? Superintendent Hilaria Bauer is a great leader—she represents her students and respects her colleagues!'
- 7) Julie Arroyo Teacher for the past ten (10) years that has been through several Superintendents. She has seen Superintendent Hilaria Bauer at several school events and she is not 'just passing through' Superintendent Hilaria Bauer has brought refreshing climate to the school sites.

2.02 Announcement and Public Comments Regarding Items to be Discussed in Closed Session

- 9) Kristin Burt LUCHA Principal and parent that has her two children enrolled at LUCHA spoke about the great things happening at her site. She commented that we are supporting the student's mental needs with all the various programs and partnerships that we have partnered with. The parent engagement with DAC and DELAC are strong. She commented that the team includes the work of the teachers, principals, vice-principals, parents, administration, and community members; however, it is the Superintendent who leads the effort to make all this possible
- 10) Tracy Leathers Ocala Principal that stated good leaders are given the opportunity to be innovative thinkers (her staff). The Superintendent has a 'personal passion'. She walks each campus and visits, speaks to teachers, students, and parents. We now have stability this is the longest Superintendent I have had in 15 years!
- 11) Candace (no last name given) Representative from Mayor Sam Liccardo's office, read an **updated** support letter signed by Mayor Sam Liccardo, Vice-Mayor Magdalena Carrasco, Councilmember Tam Nguyen, and Councilmember Sylvia Arenas. President Esau Ruiz Herrera reported that General Counsel had sent out a letter warning the Board of their actions being out of compliance as follows:

At the November 9 Board Meeting, the Board took action to move its Annual Organizational Meeting from its scheduled December 14, 2017, date to December 7, 2017. Unfortunately, that action was in violation of Education Code 35143, and Board Bylaw 9100.

Board Bylaw states in relevant part: "The Board of Trustees shall hold an Annual Organizational Meeting within the time limits prescribed by law (Education Code 35143).

Education Code 35143 provides in relevant part:

"The governing board of each school district shall hold an annual organizational meeting. In a year in which a regular election for governing board members is conducted, the meeting shall be held on a day within a 15-day period that commences with the date upon which a governing board member elected at that election takes office. Organizational meeting in years in which no such regular election for governing board members is conducted shall be held during the same 15-day period on the calendar. Unless otherwise provided by rule of the governing board, the day and time of the annual meeting shall be selected by the Board at its regular meeting held immediately prior to the first day of such 15-day period, and the Board shall notify the County Superintendent of Schools of the day and time selected." Based upon Bylaw 9100 and Education Code 35143, the Alum Rock

3. **BOARD BUSINESS** (continued)

3.01 Removal of current Board President

Board of Trustees is bound to hold its 2017 Annual Organizational Meeting on Thursday, December 14, 2017, as previously scheduled.

President Esau Ruiz Herrera shared that the discussion of a Special Board Meeting on December 7 was only to accommodate Member Khanh Tran's schedule as he had mentioned he would be traveling out of the country.

He continued to comment that it was clear about the motivation that Trustee Khanh Tran might have had and now this action is likely to be deemed a violation of the Brown Act. The Brown Act says that all discussion or contemplated action be done in a public meeting and this prohibits any discussion or collective agreements outside of the public meeting.

Member Khanh Tran commented that back in August, President Esau Ruiz Herrera had also exchanged emails and he now felt that new leadership was needed. He mentioned that the Board attempted to move the Board Meeting from December 14 to December 7; however, he felt disappointed with President Esau Ruiz Herrera that he would risk violating a code.

MOTION #10-01 by Member Khanh Tran to remove Esau Ruiz Herrera as the current Board President. MOTION #10-01 was seconded by Member Karen Martinez.

The reports include the respective purchase and maturity dates, par value, amortized cost, market value, and yield to maturity for each investment.

The yield of the pool on September 30, 2017 was 1.32%. As a comparison, on September 30, 2017 the yield of a 6-month Treasury Bill was 1.19%. A two-year Treasury Note was 1.49%. The State of California Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) yield was 1.11%.

Attached with the current investment strategy is a schedule that lists the average weighted maturities and yield for the Commingled Treasury Pool. Charts outlining investment concentration and distribution of bond maturities are provided for the Pool. Also included is a chart showing the one-year history of the pool and selected interest rates.

Securities are purchased with the expectation that they will generally be held to maturity. Unrealized gains or losses are not reflected in the yield calculations.

The market values of securities were taken from pricing services provided by BNYMellon, Bloomberg Analytics, dealer quotes, and an independent pricing service.

A combination of securities maturing, new revenues, and tax receipts will adequately cover the anticipated cash flow needs for the next six months. Cash flows are continually monitored and are considered paramount in the selection of securities purchased for the Pool.

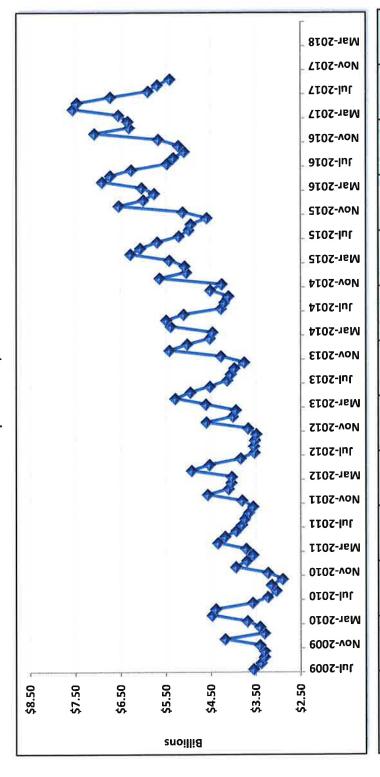
Holdings by Issuer - Percent of Commingled Pool

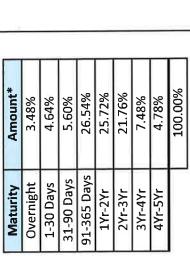

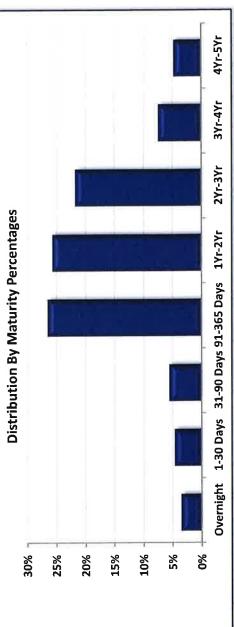

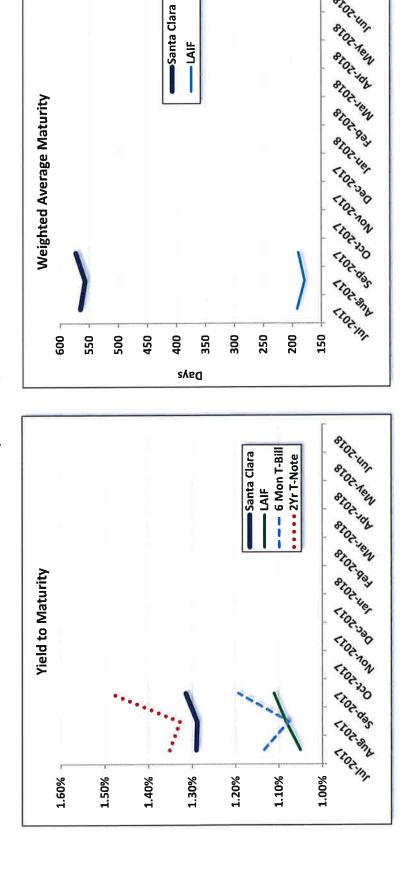

LAND USE AGREEMENT

Lyndale School 13901 Nordyke Drive, San Jose, CA 95127

This is an agreement Agreement between the Santa Clara County Office of Education (herein after referred to as "County Office of Education" and the <u>Alum Rock School District</u> (hereinafter referred to as "Owner"), to provide certain land on which portable classrooms belonging to the County Office of Education will be placed.

IT IS AGREED between the parties as follows:

1. <u>Land to be Provided</u> - Owner shall provide the land described below during the term of this agreement:

Description: Approximately 1,800 sq. ft. on Lyndale School grounds in San Jose. Address: Lyndale School, 13901 Nordyke Drive, San Jose, CA 95127

- 2. Access to Land The County Office of Education, it's officers, agents, employees licensees, and invitees and pupils in the Head Start Program and their parents or guardians, shall have all right of ingress and egress to and from the above land over such other portions of Owner's property at the location as deemed necessary for the use of the land. Such right of access shall also include keys, parking stickers and other necessary items.
- 3. Repairs and Maintenance The County Office of Education shall be responsible for all repairs to portable building that will be used for Head Start classrooms.
- 4. <u>Utilities</u> County Office of Education shall pay for it's share or usage of water, electricity, light, heat, and normal janitorial services and refuse removal; this cost is not be included in the rental fee provided below. The owner will invoice the County Office of Education once a year, no later than April 30th of each calendar year.
- 5. Rent County Office of Education shall pay the Owner the sum of \$12.00 per year, as the rent for the use of the land as set forth above.
- 6. <u>Billing</u> The above rental payment shall be made in September to District on receipt of Owner's standard invoice.
- 7. <u>Damage to Premises</u> County Office of Education shall pay Owner for the repair or replacement of any property or facilities of Owner which may be lost, damaged or stolen as a result of the County Office of Education's use of Owner's premises.
- 8. <u>Indemnification</u> County Office of Education and Owner shall mutually indemnify, hold harmless, and defend each other from any claim or damages arising from the respective acts, omissions, or errors of their respective officers, agents, or employees. It is the intention of the parties hereto that each party shall bear the financial liability, if any, attributable to their respective officers, agents, and employees.

County Office of Education agrees to furnish upon request, a certificate of insurance to the Owner, providing evidence of the above liability insurance. The certificate of insurance shall contain a provision that the Owner shall be given written notice 30 calendar days in advance of cancellation or any material change in this liability insurance policy.

9. <u>Insurance</u> - During the entire term of this Agreement and any extension thereof, Owner shall maintain in effect a policy of property insurance covering the land which is leased by the County Office of Education, providing coverage for the perils of fire, vandalism and malicious mischief, windstorm, flooding and other perils, as appropriate, in an amount representing the current replacement value of subject property. Owner agrees to provide County Office of Education upon request, with evidence of such insurance coverage.

During the entire term of this Agreement, and any extension thereof, County Office of Education shall maintain in effect a policy of comprehensive general liability insurance, including coverage of owned and unowned automobiles, providing a minimum combined single limit coverage of \$1 million for the defense of lawsuits and the payment of damages arising from bodily injury, defense of lawsuits and the payment of damages arising from bodily injury, sickness or disease, and death to any person, and property loss, damage, and destruction for each accident or occurrence, covering the Santa Clara County Office of Education, its officers, employees, and agents and the Santa Clara County Board of Education. County Office of Education agrees to furnish upon request a certificate of insurance to the Owner, providing evidence of the above liability insurance. The certificate of insurance shall contain a provision that Owners shall be given written notice 30 calendar days in advance of cancellation or any material change in this liability insurance policy.

- 10. <u>Assignments and Subcontracts</u> This agreement, or any part thereof, may not be assigned or subcontracted by either party hereto, except with the written consent of the other party. Any assignment or subcontract made without such consent shall be void, and shall, at the option of the aggreeded party, terminate the agreement.
- 11. <u>Term</u> The term of this agreement shall commence on <u>May 1, 2014</u> and shall terminate on <u>April 30, 2019</u> subject to continuing availability of Head Start funds for the purposes defined herein.
- 12. <u>Elective Termination</u> Either County Office of Education or Alum Rock Elementary School District may terminate this agreement by giving the other party, not less than sixty (60) days prior notice of termination.
- 13. Healthy School Act of 2000 County Office of Education certifies that it is in compliance with California's Healthy School Act of 2000 (AB 2260) as they relate to the use of pesticides. Owner shall provide adequate notices to the use of pesticides. Owner shall provide adequate notices to County Office of Education as required. Owner will indemnify and hold harmless the County Office of Education from all damages, penalties, and consequences imposed upon it for any failure of the Owner to comply with such provisions.

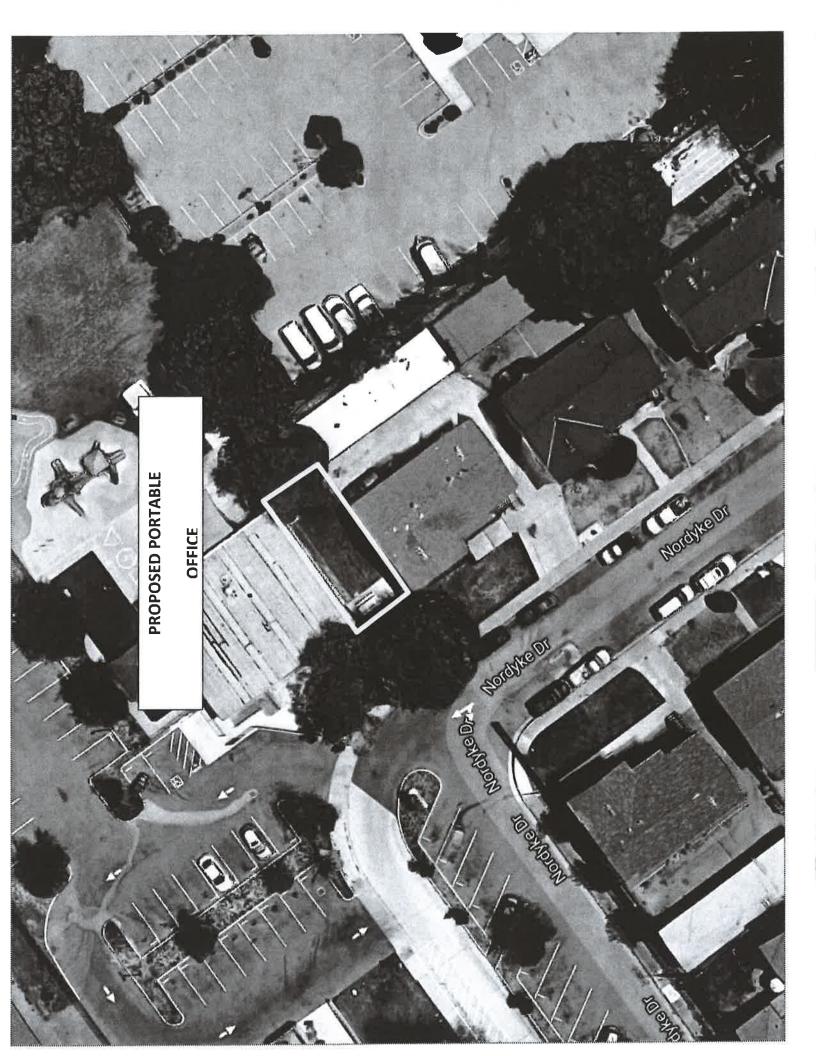
